### Westmoreland County to Celebrate Courthouse Centennial with Gala Events

On Friday, September 14, 2007, a gala event celebrating the 100th anniversary of the construction and opening of the fourth Westmoreland County Courthouse will be held at the Westmoreland County Courthouse. The Centennial Celebration Gala also kicks off a four-month-long juried art exhibition, "History Through Art," sponsored by the Southwestern Pennsylvania Council for the Arts, Inc. Approximately sixty works of art by western Pennsylvania artists will center on Westmoreland County historic themes to complement the celebration.


The magnificent Beaux Arts building that we commemorate with the Centennial Celebration Gala is the result of five years of construction begun in 1902. When the county decided to demolish the third Courthouse (built in 1854) in the summer of 1901, there was no firm plan for where the offices and Courts would be relocated. Fortunately, and coincidentally, a new apartment building was under construction just south of the Courthouse on Main Street. The county quickly made an arrangement with the owners and contractors to complete the new apartment building in 49 days. In short order, the records were relocated to this temporary facility until 1907, when the present Courthouse was completed. The apartment building at 231 South Main Street, where many lawyers and other professionals still maintain offices.

Substantially completed by the fall of 1907, the new Courthouse was occupied slowly over several months by the Courts and row offices. On January 31, 1908, a dedication ceremony was held, signifying the completion of the building. This structure has always been a source of pride not only for the lawyers and judges who served within its walls, but for the entire Westmoreland County community. The massive dome is 175 feet above street level, built in an Italian Renaissance style. The exterior is faced with light gray granite and sandstone cut on site by European stonecutters. The interior features Italian marble walls and colorful mosaic tile floors with a grand central marble staircase. Both mahogany and oak are in evidence in doors, windows, and furnishings. The interior also features fifteen different wall and ceiling murals painted by one artist. The assemblage of craftsmen from the area and from Italy was impressive; many Italian craftsmen elected to stay in Greensburg and make Westmoreland County their home.

The Centennial Celebration Gala is a black-tie-optional event with a \$40 per person charge. There will be food, a cash bar, music, and Courthouse tours—including, weather permitting, the first tours up to the Courthouse dome in 25 years. Tickets are available at the Westmoreland Bar Association office.

The gala also marks the formal release of a book celebrating the first 100 years of the structure. "This American Courthouse, 1907-2007: One Hundred Years of Service to the People of Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania," documents the history of the building through words and photographs, and memorializes the architectural legacy of William Kauffman, the man who designed our American Courthouse.

The gala is the culmination of three years' work by the Westmoreland County Courthouse Centennial Committee, comprised of judges, lawyers, and many other interested persons who have brought their many talents and good ideas to this effort. In addition to the gala and book, the committee is hosting a closing reception scheduled to coincide with the anniversary of the 1908 dedication of the Courthouse. The reception will be held on Saturday, January 26, 2008, and will be open to the public without charge

### **Juror's Statement**

How appropriate that the Celebration Committee chose to display the History Through Art exhibit in the halls of the majestic Westmoreland County Courthouse during the Centennial Celebration. The support of the visual arts by the Celebration Committee is applauded and greatly appreciated. Support of the arts always enriches the community from which it is created.

The artwork which comprises this exhibit is extremely varied because of the latitude of the guidelines for this exhibit and the variety of artists who submitted works. As juror, I tried to remain faithful to the theme of the show and choose work which best expressed the eligibility guidelines detailed in the prospectus.

After viewing the work several times, I decided to choose work which best expressed the historical theme of the exhibit, recognizing work which was best technically and conceptually.

Thank you for the opportunity to jury the History Through Art exhibit for the Southwestern Pennsylvania Council for the Arts. It was an enjoyable exhibit to view and jury. My hope is that the viewers of this exhibit will enjoy my selections as much as I did.
